Initial assessment for other courses

English, digital skills and vocational courses

The initial assessments for English, digital skills and vocational courses are by appointment.

Before your assessment

You will be asked to:

- register online (or with staff support) - See page 10 How to register and enrol
- share brief details about your previous learning or qualifications
- book an assessment appointment on our website www.learnrealing.org.uk

This helps us make sure the assessment is right for you.

At the assessment

Your assessment may include:

- a short skills activity (for example reading or writing)
- a brief conversation about your goals and experience
- advice on the most suitable course and level

What we check for you

During the process, we will also:

- check funding eligibility
- review prior learning
- confirm whether the course is fully funded or has a fee
- explain next steps

You don't need to work this out on your own as staff will guide you.

After your assessment

We will:

- confirm the course and level recommended
- let you know if a place is available
- explain start dates, fees (if any), and progression options

Sometimes we may recommend a different course, a short preparatory course, or the next available start date to align better with your needs.

Initial assessment for ESOL

How assessment works

Everyone must complete an initial assessment before starting a course. This helps us place you on the right course and level so you can learn confidently and progress. The assessment also helps us plan progression, including whether a learner is ready for vocational or higher-level study. We use the assessment to understand your skills, experience and goals, and explain your next steps.

ESOL assessment: two simple stages

Stage 1: Registration

We register your details, check basic eligibility, and ask a few short questions about your English level, previous learning and goals. This is not a full assessment. It helps us book the right ESOL assessment appointment for you.

Stage 2: ESOL assessment appointment

You attend a booked session with short speaking and listening, reading and writing activities, plus a conversation with a tutor. This usually takes 30 to 40 minutes. Afterwards, we confirm your level, explain your next steps, and let you know about course start dates.

Funding eligibility 2026 to 2027



Am I eligible?

You may be eligible for our courses if:

- you are 19 or older on 31 August 2026
- your course takes place in England
- you usually need to live in London to access our courses. In some cases, learners outside London may still be eligible depending on the funding available

And one of the following applies:

- you have the right to live in the United Kingdom
- you have an eligible immigration status (e.g. refugee status, humanitarian protection, leave to remain)
- you are part of a recognised scheme (e.g. Ukraine or Afghan schemes)
- you are an asylum seeker (conditions apply)



Not eligible if:

- student visa and visiting the United Kingdom
- visa restricts study and no legal permission



Please bring:

- proof of status in the UK (British passport, eVisa or Home Office documents)
- national Insurance number (card, payslip, or letter)
- proof of benefits (Universal credit, Employment Support Allowance, Jobseekers Allowance or other state benefits from the last 3 months)
- previous UK qualifications

Fee information

Many Learn Ealing courses are funded through the Adult Skills Fund (ASF). Most courses are funded by the Greater London Authority for London residents. Some courses are funded by the Department for Education and may be available to learners outside London.

Whether you pay a fee depends on your eligibility. We will check this before you enrol and explain any costs clearly.

No fee

You will not pay a fee if you are entitled to full funding under ASF rules.

This includes learners who:

- are unemployed, including those receiving eligible income-based benefits
- are employed or self-employed and earn below the London Living Wage threshold
- are studying eligible English courses, including accredited ESOL, and do not already hold a Level 2 qualification in English

Fee payable

You may need to pay a fee if you:

- are employed or self-employed
- earn above the London Living Wage threshold
- do not meet the criteria for full funding

Any fees charged will be in line with our Fees and Remission Policy. Instalment options may be available.

Discretionary fee remission

In some cases, fee remission may be considered for learners who are not automatically entitled to full funding but are facing hardship or other barriers to learning.

Any fee remission must be approved and recorded in line with our policy.

Full fee courses

Some professional, specialist or employer-focused courses are not publicly funded and have a full course fee. Full fees are shown clearly before booking.

Many Learn Ealing courses are publicly funded, which means many learners pay nothing or only a small contribution towards materials and administration.

We will always check your eligibility and explain any costs clearly before you enrol.

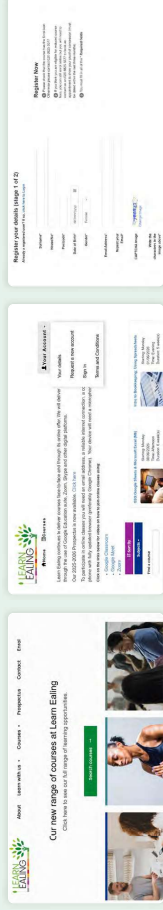

Step 2

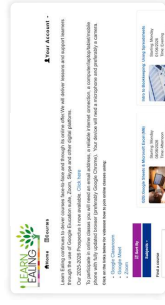
Click on **Your account** on the right-hand side, and choose **Request a new account**

Learning in action case study

Learning can help you feel more confident and ready for work. That's what happened for Keriya, who is training to work with children in the borough.

Keriya moved to the UK from Ethiopia. She has always wanted to work with children. At Learn Ealing, she studies ESOL and a level 3 early years educator course. As part of her early years course, she volunteers in a nursery.

“It has a family atmosphere. The staff and children are so nice. The managers explain everything and I learn so much from shadowing staff.”

The challenge

When Keriya started, UK childcare rules and safeguarding were new to her. She was also building her English at the same time.

What changed

Now, Keriya feels more confident and independent. She says she can book appointments by herself, and her understanding is much better.

The future

Keriya wants to keep studying and work towards a career in childcare.

Learning in action case study

Learning something new can build confidence and give you the right skills. Reza took a community interpreting course so he can help people in a clearer, more professional way.

Reza had been informally interpreting for more than 14 years. He joined Learn Ealing to learn and understand about the principles of interpreting via a level 1 community interpreting course.

“I have been volunteering as an interpreter in my community for 14 years. I am passionate about supporting others and joined this course to develop my knowledge and gain a clear understanding of the principles behind the role.”

The challenge

Reza had lots of experience, but he wanted to understand the professional rules, like being fair, accurate, and respectful.

What changed

Reza learned what interpreters should do (and what not to do). He also learned over 500 new terms, and he feels more confident when supporting others.

The future

Reza plans to move on to Level 2 community interpreting course which will start in autumn 2026. He is retired, but he wants to keep helping people in the borough.

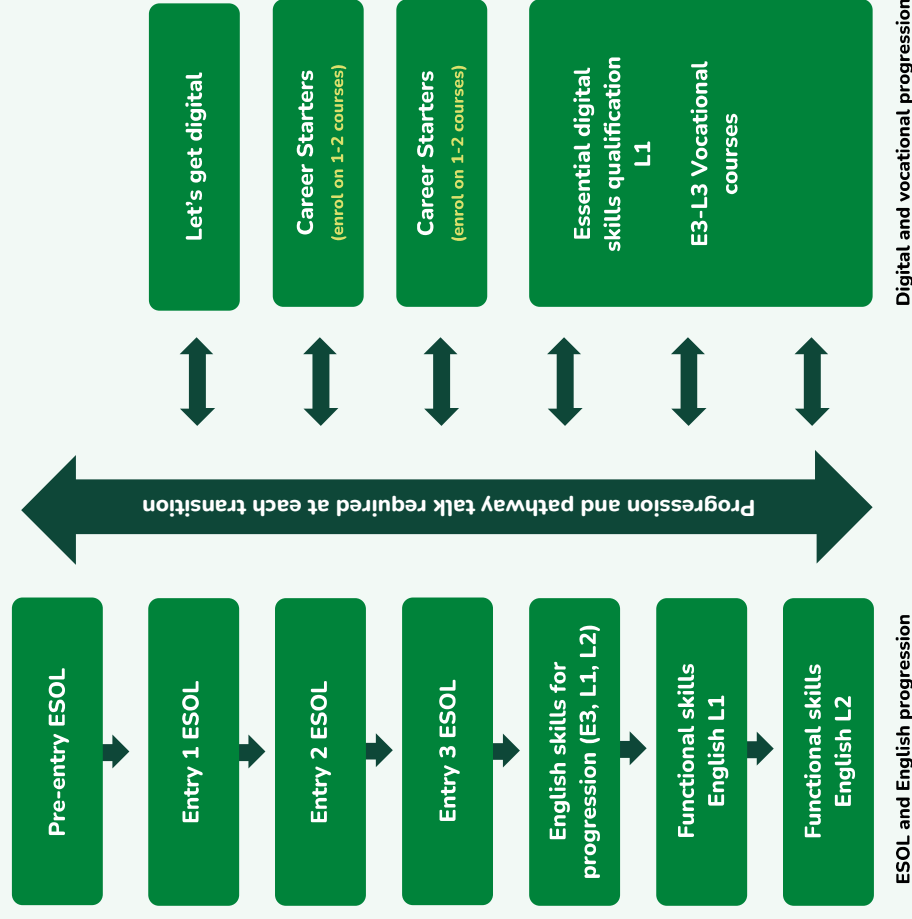

Functional skills English are nationally recognised, exam based qualifications accepted by employers, colleges and training providers.

Level 1 – English for work and everyday life

Level 2 – Higher level literacy, equivalent to GCSE grades 4–9, supporting further study

Schools and community learning

Our short, local schools and community learning courses help parents, carers and community members build confidence and practical skills. They could be a supportive first step into learning and clear routes into further training or work. How the learning works

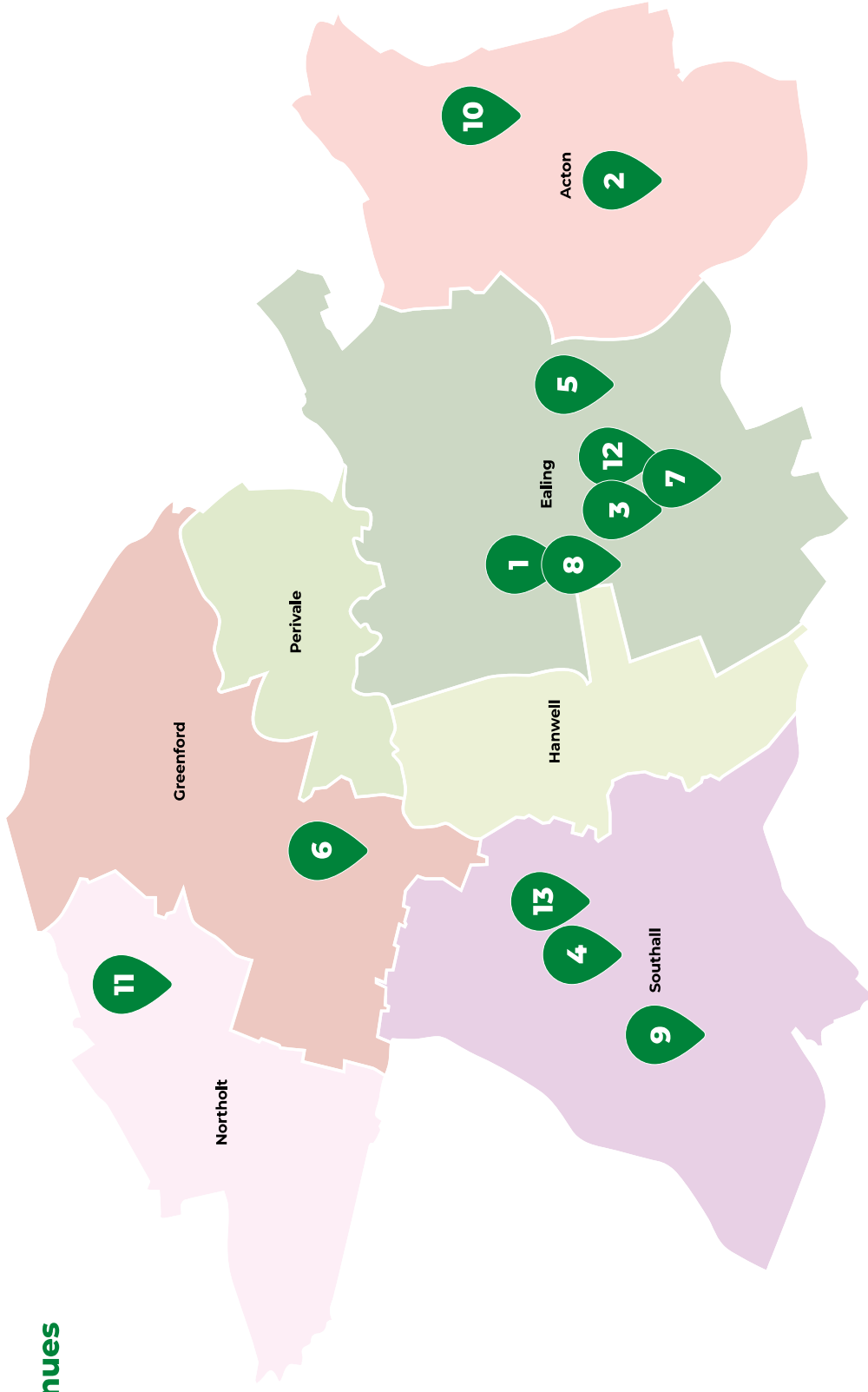
- non-exam and supportive - a welcoming first step back into learning
